

Veahavta Puzzle

25 Minutes





Instructions:

- 1. Place the carbon paper over the puzzle with the black side facing down onto the puzzle. Lightly tape it on the sides so it does not move as you work.
- **2.** Place the printable stencil paper on top of the carbon paper and tape it down on the sides as well.
- **3.** Use your pen to trace over the black stencil lines. Make sure to press as hard as you can as you trace.
- **4.** When you finish tracing remove the stencil paper and the carbon paper. The image should now be visible on the puzzle.
- **5.** Use your coloring utensils to color in the picture and the letters and to decorate your puzzle how you like.
- **6.** Take the pieces apart and now you've got your very own Veahavta Puzzle to add to your puzzle collection!

DIY Judaica

Hand Shrinky Dinks Keychain

25 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Pour some paint onto the plate to cover the surface with a thin layer.
- 2. Dip your hand flat in the paint and make sure your whole palm is covered in a thin layer of paint.
- **3.** Stamp your hand onto the rough side of the Shrinky Dink sheet.
- 4. Carefully, without touching the wet paint, cut around the handprint. Be careful not to cut too close to it.

- **5.** Punch a hole where you want your keychain to hang from, either the bottom of the palm or at the top of the fingers.
- 6. Put the cut out handprint on a tray and, with adult supervision, place it in an oven preheated to 350 degrees. Bake for about 3-4 minutes (or according to package instructions). Watch them shrink!
- 7. Remove the shrinky dinks from the oven. When they are slightly cooled, use a paint brush to Mod Podge over the paint.
- 8. Let the Mod Podge dry, then attach the jump ring and key ring and there you have it! A handprint shrinky dink keychain!



Mosaic Art

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Use a ruler and pencil to trace a 6" x 6" square on your cardboard piece. Cut out the square.
- **2.** Cut out the printed mosaic outline and glue it onto the cardboard piece. (If you choose to create your own original design, skip this step.)
- **3.** Plan out your design. If using the printed mosaic outline, place the tiles inside the outlines and design your tiles to fit the spaces. If you're creating your own original design place the tiles in whatever position you'd like.
 - **Tip:** Try not to overlap squares, trim the foam into different shaped pieces as necessary to fit where they need to.
- **4.** Once your design is laid out it's time to stick or glue the tiles onto your baseboard.
- 5. Peel and stick (or glue) the foam tiles onto your cardboard to create a gorgeous artwork. If using glue you can paint the entire board with glue first first, or put a little bit on at a time and stick the pieces on as you go.






Take the Challenge

Instructions:


 Cut the paper into strips 1¼ inches wide by 8 inches long.



2. Fold the strip in half to create a crease in the middle.



3. Fold the paper toward the middle crease and repeat the same fold on the other side.



4. Fold the strip again from outside to the middle crease and repeat for both sides.

- **9.** Mark a start and finish line for your caterpillar race on the table or floor.
- **10.** If playing with a partner, race to get to the finish line first! If playing by yourself, time yourself to see how fast it can take you to get from start to finish.



Ahavat Yisroel Cookies

② 25 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Preheat the oven to 350. Line the cookie sheet with parchment paper.
- **2.** Mix all the ingredients into the bowl.
- **3.** Roll out the dough with your rolling pin.
- **4.** Use the cookie cutter to cut out as many people as you can.
- **5.** Gather the leftover dough and repeat step 3 & 4 until there is no dough left.
- **6.** Place your cookies on the pan. Not too close to each other.
- **7.** Bake at 350° for 20 minutes
- 8. When the cookies are ready, let them cool off.
- **9.** Use the frosting and candies to decorate your cookie friends!

Ice Cream Sundae Sand Art

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- 1. This project can get messy, we recommend doing it outside on the pavement.
- 2. Pour salt on a piece of paper, enough to make a layer about ¼" thick in your ice cream sundae cup.
- 3. Choose a chalk color and rub the chalk back and forth across the salt until you get the color to mix into the salt.



4. Carefully, pour a layer of colored salt into the ice cream sundae cup.



Tip: Pour layers at angles and around the jar to make it interesting. You can

rotate the jar while pouring to do this.

5. Repeat steps 1-3 with new colors until your ice cream sundae cup is completely full, leaving a little space on top for glue.

Tips: Use the opposite side or a new piece of the paper to make a new salt color to keep the colors from mixing. Be careful not to shake the cup as this will mix the layers up and turn it brown.

- **6.** When your cup is full, cover the top of it with a thick layer of glue.
- 7. Place cotton balls on top for ice cream and a pom pom as the cherry on top!
- **8.** Cut the straw in half and insert the top half into the glue, careful not to shake around the colored layers.
- **9.** Let dry and and then enjoy your ice cream sundae sand art!

Ages 4-6 | (1) 15 Minutes

Instructions:

1. Cut the black construction paper into any shape.



2. Fill the bowl half full with water.



3. Drop a few drops of nail polish into the water.



4. Quickly dip your black paper flat onto the area of the nail polish.



5. Take it out and let it dry on a paper towel. The rainbow will slowly appear.



What's Happening?

When you dip the paper into the water it gets coated with a thin layer of nail polish. Light is reflected by the layer of nail polish, creating rainbow patterns. This is basically the same thing that happens when a rainbow is naturally formed in the sky.

Bottle Rocket Explosion

Ages 7-10 | (1) 20 Minutes

This is an outdoor activity.

Instructions:



Tape the pencils to the bottle.

2.



Carefully pour the vinegar into the bottle. Fill it 1/3 full.

- **3.** Lay open the paper towel, and pour the baking soda in the middle.
- **4.** Fold the bottom of the paper towel up, to hold the baking powder.
- **5.** Next, fold the sides in and roll it, to fit into the spout of the bottle.



- **6.** Slowly start inserting the baking soda packet into the opening of the bottle, be careful not to drop the whole thing in.
- **7.** When the packet is almost completely into the bottle, use the cork to hold the packet in place.



- **8.** Give it a shake and quickly turn it over so that the bottle is standing on the pencils.
- 9. Stand back, wait patiently, it won't take long. Watch your rocket take off!!

What's Happening?

When the baking soda and vinegar combine it creates a chemical reaction and releases a gas called Carbon Dioxide. Since there is so much gas trapped in the bottle, it causes the

Duct Tape Wallet

② 20 Minutes



Instructions:

- Watch the instructional video link to help guide you.
- **2.** Make a 7"x9" double sided sheet of duct tape.
 - Cut 4 pieces of tape, about 10" long, and lay them on your work surface, sticky side up.
 - Overlap the strips of duct tape until you have a 7"x9" sheet.



Make another sheet.
Cut another 4 pieces of tape, about 10" long and overlap the strips until you have another 7" x 9" sheet.

 Carefully stick the adhesive sides of the two duct-tape sheets together, lining up the edges.



Use scissors to trim the ends.

Duct Tape Wallet (continued)

3. Fold the sheet horizontally to resemble a wallet shape and tape the edges closed with 1" wide tape. Use scissors to trim the ends.



- 4. Make pockets.
 - Cut (2) 5" strips of tape and press them together sticky side to sticky side.



 Fold and tape a 1" strip of tape over the 5" edge.
 Trim the pocket to 4" long.



- 5. Add the pockets
 - Fold the wallet in half to create a bi-fold wallet.
 Make sure the edges meet, then use your fingernail or a ruler to make a crease along the edge.
 - Using ½" strips of duct tape, stick the pocket in place by taping the bottom seam and 2 side seams of the pocket onto one half of the wallet. Be sure to leave the top side open so you can fit a credit card inside.



- You can add more pockets to your wallet by repeating steps 3 and 4.
- **6.** That's it! You just made a wallet completely out of duct tape!

Spy Decoder

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the 3 circles from the spy decoder template.
 - Optional: Add a cardstock backing to each circle to make it more sturdy and last longer. Cut out the cardstock to fit the circles and glue them onto the back of the circles.
- **2.** Make a hole in the center of each circle using a pencil to poke a hole.
- 3. Line up the circles from largest to smallest, keeping their center holes in line.
- **4.** Attach the circles with a paper fastener through their centers.
- 5. Draw your own letters, numbers or symbols in the empty spaces on the medium sized middle circle. (symbol examples: star, heart, smiley face, etc.)

- what letter "A" on the outside circle should match with on the middle circle. Write the code key on the inside of your spy decoder wheel. (write which letter/symbol/number matches the letter "A" on the outside circle).
- 7. To write a secret message, match the letter "A" on the outside circle with your chosen letter/symbol/number. Write your message from what they would be on the big circle to what they are on the middle circle.
- **8.** Send your secret message along with your spy decoder wheel to a friend.
- **9.** Pass messages back and forth that no one else can read!

DIY Heart Pillow

30 Minutes

Instructions:

- Draw a big heart filling your blank sheet of paper and cut it out.
- as a stencil to cut your felt.

 Place the paper heart on
 a sheet of felt and cut the
 felt around it. Do the same
 with your second sheet of
 felt.



- 3. Once you have 2 felt hearts place them on top of each other and make sure they line up as much as you can.
- 4. Using scissors, cut a slit through both felt pieces about 2 inches deep.
 Work your way around the edge of the heart and cut slits 2 inches deep all around leaving ½ an inch in between each slit. Now you have fringes all around!



the top felt and the fringe under it from the bottom felt that line up and tie them together two times into a knot. Continue to tie all the fringes around the heart until you have five left next to each other. You will now have an opening into the heart.



- **6.** Stuff the heart with the pillow stuffing until it's nice and plump and then go ahead and tie the rest of the fringes.
- 7. Use the fabric marker to write "Love your fellow" on your pillow and decorate it with mini hearts as you wish or you can leave it with just the words.

- **3.** Pour in enough water to cover the baking soda and cornstarch mixture in each bottle and stir until smooth.
- **4.** Add food coloring to each container and mix it up. Have fun playing with the colors, mix and match to make new colors.
 - **Tip:** Red and blue make purple. Yellow and blue make green. Yellow and red make orange.
- **5.** Allow the fun to begin! Make shapes, draw lines, and make designs on the pavement with the homemade sidewalk chalk paint you just created.
- **6.** Fill a bottle full of vinegar. Once you've created a design, pour the vinegar over it and watch it fizz!
- **7.** Repeat with different designs- try to make one that connects to something you learned in camp this week!

Instructions:

- 1. Prepare your work area by spreading out some newspaper or a garbage bag to cover the surface.
- 2. Cut up your decorative paper into small sized pieces. You can make a variety of shapes and sizes. If using paper confetti only, skip this step.
- 3. In a disposable cup, mix glue with water to make the mixture thinner and easier to paint onto the balloon.
- **4.** Blow up a balloon to medium size and with a marker, carefully mark a line about halfway through it.



5. Holding the top of the balloon in one hand, paint a section of the balloon.



6. Place the decorative paper pieces on the glue section.

- Continue painting sections of the balloon until it's completely covered in paper.
- 8. Paint another layer of glue on top of the paper and make another 2-3 layers to create a thich cover layer over the balloon.
- 9. When all the layers have been painted, turn the balloon upside down and rest it inside a jar or cup. Let dry for 24 hours.



dry, turn the balloon layers are dry, turn the balloon over so the uncovered side is on top and carefully pop the balloon (use a scissor to make a small cut). Pull out any remaining balloon pieces that may have stuck inside the ball and put them in the garbage.



11. Optional: Trim the top of your bowl to make a straight edge.



12. Fill your balloon bowl with coins for Tzedakah or markers and pens. Enjoy!
